We are excited to be opening our 2024/25 season with the world premiere of *The Ballad of Hattie and James* by Samuel Adamson who is returning to Kiln Theatre after the 'inspiring' (The Telegraph) *Wife* (2019). We will then be welcoming *English*, an exciting collaboration with the RSC which is part of Daniel Evans and Tamara Harvey's inaugural season. Completing *Indhu Rubasingham*'s final season at Kiln Theatre we have another Kiln commission, *Peanut Butter & Blueberries* by Suhaiymah Manzoor-Khan. As Indhu said, 'It feels fitting that I end my tenure as I stared – with debut plays'.

We have also just transferred our production of the 'flawless' (The Observer) new British musical by **Jim Barne & Kit Buchan**, *Two Strangers (Carry A Cake Across New York)*, into the West End, at the Criterion Theatre.

Our values shape the way we work. FUNDING

Our annual turnover is approximately £3.5 million. Kiln Theatre receives funding from the Arts Council England as a National Portfolio Organisation. Other income comes from box office ticket sales and other revenue streams, with a final sum generated through fundraising.

THE ROLE

Title: Kiln-Mackintosh Resident Assistant Director

Location: Kiln Theatre, 269 Kilburn High Road, London NW6 7JR

Contract: Full-time, fixed term: 12 months from Monday 1st July 2024

Purpose and description of role

In a time of uncertainty for those pursuing a career as a theatre director, we are delighted to offer a full-time paid role for one year. This role aims to give an early career director the opportunity to gain an in-depth understanding of how producing theatres of different scales (subsidised and commercial) work and to receive bespoke mentoring in preparation for their future freelance career.

The Resident Assistant Director will be based within the Artistic Team at Kiln Theatre. They will follow a number of Kiln productions throughout the rehearsal process, gaining first-hand experience as the Assistant Director on the world premiere of *Peanut Butter and Blueberries* by Suhaiymah Manzoor Khan, as well as assisting Artistic Director, Amit Sharma, and supporting on other shows in his opening season.

Additionally, the Resident Assistant Director will support the Artistic Team by reading scripts, completing script reports and contributing to Artistic Team meetings. They will also provide broad creative support to Kiln's Creative Engagement programme as required.

As part of Kiln's partnership with The Mackintosh Foundation to create this role, the Kiln-Mackintosh Resident Assistant Director will also get additional experiences working with Cameron Mackintosh's West End productions, where possible.

We want this role to provide the stability to take the risks often required in early stages of careers in theatre directing. We will support the Resident Assistant Director's development during their time at Kiln, and there will be built-in flexibility to allow them to make the most of Kiln-based opportunities, including mentoring from Kiln's New Work Associate, whilst also exploring other theatre connections and building their networks of peers across the industry.

Who is this role for?

Ideally the candidate would have between 2–5 years' experience as a theatre director, but please note this is a guide and not a set requirement. They will have also made their own work for a paying audience for a run of at least one week.

We strongly encourage applications from those who are currently underrepresented in the group of established working theatre directors in the UK. This includes those who have experienced barriers in getting their work developed and produced in theatre because of race/ethnicity, class, disability, sexuality or any other barrier.

Key responsibilities

Assisting on Kiln productions

- Assisting at least two directors in delivering their creative visions on productions in Kiln's 2024 and 2025 programme including the world premiere of *Peanut Butter and Blueberries*, July-August and the first show of Amit Sharma's debut season, September-November;
- Joining or shadowing the creative team of other productions;
- Providing research materials ahead of rehearsals as requested by the Director;
- Arranging for visiting experts on rehearsal topics (this may also need to be arranged ahead of rehearsals);
- Assisting with casting as required;
- Contributing to creative discussions when needed;
- Assisting with rehearsal scheduling;
- Supporting the actors with line-learning or supervising secondary rehearsals;
- Supporting the Stage Management and Technical Teams during rehearsals and the technical period;
- Supporting the Director during the technical rehearsal and preview period, which may include checking sightlines, taking performance notes or rehearsing scene changes;
- Attending at least one performance per week after opening, assisting in monitoring the production, taking notes and feeding back to the Director and Artistic Team, and, where instructed, offering feedback to the company;
- Assisting on productions or projects with partner theatres;
- Attending Camera Rehearsals for any digital output such as a streamed performance;
- Collaborating with other departments to contribute to work related to the production. For example, this may involve working with: Creative Engagement on education packs or workshops; or Marketing to provide content for the production;
- Keeping track of and typing up daily script changes, emailing them to the Writer and Director after consultation with the Deputy Stage Manager;
- Assisting the New Work Associate and Producer by maintaining an excellent working knowledge of the productions and acting as a key point of contact internally and externally, working with the Producer on matters as they arise; and working closely with the Company Manager and Production team to ensure effective communication and ongoing pastoral care where necessary.

Being part of the Artistic Team

- Join artistic meetings and contribute to the planning, development and delivery of the creative programme
- Read scripts, submit script reports and contribute to script feedback meetings
- Attend internal and external productions, workshops and readings as required
- Support with the administration and development of new work and talent development

Supporting the Creative Engagement programme

- Supporting the Youth & Pathways Manager and the Communities Manager in delivering creative elements of youth and community projects
- Supporting the Minding the Gap & Schools Manager by contributing to workshops for schools and education packs for Kiln productions, if required.

General

- Promote, maintain and work to deliver the mission and values of Kiln Theatre
- Be an active and supportive member of Kiln Theatre's staff team, attending regular staff and company meetings

- Comply with all statutory requirements, particularly in respect of GDPR, the Equalities Act 2010, Health & Safety regulations and Kiln Theatre's Safeguarding and Environmental Policies
- Where possible, attend Kiln events such as first day of rehearsals, performances, creative engagement activities, internal and external meetings as appropriate.
- Work collaboratively with other Kiln departments, including Marketing, Finance, Fundraising, Operations, etc to gain a full picture of how a producing theatre of Kiln's scale works.
- Carry out such other duties as may reasonably be required by the New Work Associate, Artistic Team, Producer and Director which the role is assisting.

Person Specification

- Passion and experience as a theatre director making your own work for a paying audience for a run of at least one week
- Demonstrable interest and/or experience in developing and directing new writing
- Ability to give strong notes and to be observant and constructive when watching rehearsals and performances
- Ability to run a room with confidence in a rehearsal and/or workshop context getting the best out of the artists and participants
- An ability to multi-task and respond quickly and reliably to tasks as required by the artistic team
- An interest in making work in a Community and Young Persons setting
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills, able to be positive and approachable when dealing with a wide range of artists at all levels
- Understanding and support for Kiln's mission
- Enjoyment of being part of a team
- Excellent timekeeping and organisation skills
- Commitment to inclusion and equality of opportunity
